### JUNIOR YEAR

# September

- Sign up for the SAT
- Begin to prepare for the SAT

## October

• Take the SAT

# **November - December**

- Search for colleges
- Explore majors and careers

January

 Register online for spring SAT tests (<u>www.collegeboard.com/reg</u>)

**February** 

- Talk to teachers about taking SAT Subject Tests this spring
- Consider taking Advanced Placement (AP) classes in the fall

### March

- Visit colleges while in session (www.collegeboard.com/visits)
- Plan a summer job/ internship/ summer class etc.

# April

Study for the spring SAT

### June

- Study for Finals
- Begin summer job/ internship/ classes etc.

### July - August

- Narrow your college list
- Gather applications and financial aid information from colleges

## SENIOR YEAR

## September

- Register and prepare for fall SAT
- Begin search for college scholarships
- Search colleges and look for application deadlines (<a href="https://www.collegeboard.com/collegesearch">www.collegeboard.com/collegesearch</a>)

# October

- Take the SAT
- Request recommendations from teachers
- Meet early decision and early action application deadlines
- Start all other college applications
- Write your college application essays

## **November**

- Send SAT scores online to meet application deadlines
- Student and parent sign up for a PİN number at (www.pin.ed.gov) for the FAFSA for January

#### December

• Check with Registrar to see that your name is spelled correctly for diplomas

# **January**

- Complete the FAFSA online before deadlines
- Send transcripts to colleges

### **February**

 Apply for financial aid before priority deadlines, to receive the most aid

#### March

Explore majors for college

### May

• Inform counselors of your future plans by completing survey in English class (will appear in Commencement Program)

## June

- Study for Finals
- Send final transcripts to your colleges
- Join the LACHSA Alumni Association

#### July

- Notify the financial aid office of your college about any scholarships you've been offered
- Prepare for college in the Fall
